Personal Statements - A Guide for Year 11 Students

Sitting down to write your personal statement

- You will not do this in one evening – it will take time
- You may not get it right first time- not everyone does
- Start by getting the ideas down on paper
- Once you have the basic ideas that you want to include and then write in full sentences and paragraphs.
- Remember to use correct punctuation and capital letters at the start of sentences
- When it's finished. Leave it. Read it again the next day. Can you see areas you need to improve?
- When you are finally happy with it, then you can show it to a teacher, parent/carer or Oona your Careers Adviser to check

Sample sentences to help you write your personal statement.

Use the phrases below to help you write your personal statements. Think about how you could improve or extend them and make them personal to you.

Demonstrating your skills

Give examples of when you demonstrated these skills/talents. It doesn't have to be too detailed.

Attendance and punctuality

Having excellent attendance and punctuality shows your commitment – make sure you include a sentence about it in your personal statement and/or complete this section of the application in full.

What else do you do outside of school? Let the college know what our hobbies or interests you have. It will help them to build a picture about you and the kind of person you are.

Final Paragraph

You can write a standard personal statement about you, but then help it really stand out by making sure the last paragraph matches the college – its vision, values and mission statements (read the college website carefully). By doing this you can personalise all you applications by just changing the last paragraph.

Checklist

Have you:

- Demonstrated why you are suited to the course
- Demonstrated why you are interested in the course
- Demonstrated that you are a good student who would be an asset to the college
- Demonstrated that you are a hardworking and committed student

Have you:

- Attended an open day or evening
- Completed ALL sections of the application
- Checked your punctuation, spelling and grammar
- Checked that it is presented neatly
- Have you checked your predicted results? Are they accurate? Check with your individual subject teachers if you are not sure.
- Do you have the correct predicted grades for the course that you are applying for?
- Had it checked by a teacher in school/parent/your careers adviser
