Our motto is 'Learn, Dream, Achieve'. We have high expectations for our pupils and aim to nurture in them a self-belief that will enable them to achieve their best and realise their dreams and ambitions through hard work and involving themselves fully in what school has to offer them.

We are proud to be the only Specialist Science College in Bolton. Our focus is on high academic standards and providing a first-rate, all round education for children of all abilities. Teachers are highly qualified and our facilities are well maintained with excellent ICT resources.

Our most recent Ofsted report (May 2019) stated that Sharples is a **good school**. The inspectors witnessed what I see every day, which is that Sharples is a caring, inclusive learning community where **pupils achieve well**. The Ofsted report also recognises that the school motto 'Learn, dream, achieve' lies at the heart of everything we do and that our **staff go the 'extra mile' to support all students**. Staff and pupils are proud of the school and our aim is to be an **outstanding school**. Outcomes are improving year on year and pupil progress is excellent. The vast majority of Sharples pupils go onto further education at 16 and large numbers enter higher education at 18.

The school's ethos is friendly, caring and disciplined, focused on the school behaviour code of the 4Cs - Courtesy, Consideration, Co-operation and Common Sense. We encourage pupils to be involved in a wide range of activities, for example:

- **STEM Club** (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths).
- **Sport** - traditional sports to the more contemporary, e.g. Futsal, cricket and swimming.
- **Music** - we offer a range of subsidised instrumental lessons and our choir and Samba band are both highly acclaimed, making frequent performances across Bolton and further afield.
- **Drama** - annual productions and regular workshops with local primary schools.

We believe education should be a challenging and enjoyable experience, where hard work and a desire to achieve the very best bring their own rewards. We support our pupils to gain the high value qualifications they need for further education and life after school.

- Formed partnerships with local universities to enhance and enrich the learning experience.



Transition

A successful transition is an important first step in helping your child achieve their full potential. At Sharples School we aim to provide a structured and well planned transition in order to ease pupils through this exciting phase of their lives.

We aim:

- To make sure each child is happy when they move from their primary school to Sharples;
- To support parents in preparing for the move from primary to secondary school;
- To encourage each child to become more independent;
- To ensure that any relevant information from the primary school or outside agencies is acknowledged and acted upon.

We use a range of strategies to help ease the transition process and ensure it is successful, These include:

- An open invitation for parents to come in and tour the school;
- Taster days and activities for year 5 and 6 pupils;
- Enrichment programmes for Year 5 and 6 pupils delivered by our staff;
- Regular visits to primary schools by members of staff;
- English and Maths masterclasses and science shows for primary schools, delivered by our specialist teachers;
- Two transition teachers who are qualified to teach from year 5 to year 9;
- Free invitations to our annual production;
- Open evening and open days for potential new pupils and their families;
- Unique graduation activity from Year 6 to 7, featuring The Tie Ceremony;
- Freshers' Week led by our prefect school leaders to assist new pupil with the settling in process.
- We are always happy to discuss with parents/carers additional support any child needs in order to ensure transition is as successful as possible.



Academic Success

Achievement and progress are central to the vibrant learning culture at Sharples School.

We have very high expectations for pupils and staff alike at Sharples. Academic success is at the heart of everything we do. There is an ethos of hard work and no excuses, as we encourage pupils to be the best they can be in our '100% classrooms'.

Rigorous assessments are carried out in all subjects to ensure pupil progress is carefully tracked from Years 7 -11 to secure improvement. Early identification of underperformance allows for immediate intervention to ensure all children achieve their full academic potential.

Our inclusive, learner-centred curriculum has been designed to support our pupils in their development as successful lifelong learners, confident individuals and responsible citizens.

Literacy, numeracy and computing are central to learning at Sharples. The development of these core skills, combined with exciting, engaging lessons leading to a broad range of qualifications, will ensure your child is equipped to succeed, whatever pathway they choose on leaving Sharples.

Diversity and choice in the Sharples curriculum promote:

STEM

Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths.

Over the last 40 years, we have established ourselves as the leading provider of STEM pathways for young people. Sharples is the only Science Specialist College in Bolton and this status is something that we are very proud of.

Sharples excels in the sciences and other STEM subjects. Our specialist science status means we are able to focus resources and expertise in these areas. With outstanding specialists in Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Maths, Engineering and Technology, we have a long-established history of success in the sciences and results improve year on year.

We use the STEM subjects of Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths as a driving force to raise standards across the school in achievement, teaching and learning, but most importantly we foster a love of learning in our students.

We currently offer the prestigious Triple Award Science alongside the Double award and Vocational Science; GCSE Astronomy, Maths, Statistics and Further Maths; Computer Science; Animal Care and a range of Design Technology subjects. Our new course in Engineering will see the STEM discipline united and will help to meet the greatly increased demand for engineers in the UK.

Technology, Science and Maths clubs take place in school every week and include our very popular Dissection Club for budding veterinarians and medics!

We have a suite of state of the art laboratories to complement our specialist science status, including our unique Sharples Community observatory to support Astronomy GCSE and the Bolton Astronomical Society which holds Star parties at Sharples School.

The Sharples Baccalaureate

At Sharples School we believe that a powerful curriculum also provides students with opportunities to develop their character as well as their minds. From those students that aspire to access the best universities to those wishing to take their dream job, a person must have developed the skills that make them stand out from the crowd. Part of this is also encouraging our students to see themselves as a positive influence on their wider community, this is also actively encouraged throughout a child's time here at the school.

We are proud to announce the development of our very own Key Stage 3 Sharples Baccalaureate programme that offers a wide programme of extra curricular activities for students to access. There are societies in Geography, History and other subjects across the curriculum, we have Debating Societies, Polyglot Club (MFL), Chess and Literature Review Clubs to name a few. All of these seek to develop your child's skills in Leadership, Community Involvement, STEM, Creativity and Sports Participation.

As students move up through the school these skills are developed further through the completion of the Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme. This builds on the attributes developed in Key Stage 3 and further develops skills of team building, leadership and community involvement.

At Sharples, we ensure that the learning experience supports all of our learners to develop to their full potential. Our academically most able learners are creative, innovative and inquisitive.

The learning experience at Sharples School challenges our more able learners through stimulating, engaging lesson delivered by outstanding teachers across the curriculum. Extra opportunities are provided for these pupils to take responsibility for their own learning, so that they develop as independent enquirers, creative thinkers and reflective learners who go on to achieve the highest academic standards.

Our curriculum is enriched by trips around the UK and indeed the world. From residential taster sessions at Oxford and other universities plus a trip to Paris to visit Europe's largest science museum and participating in various competitions, our students' agenda is very full.

The Sharples G2G programme is specifically designed to enrich and extend the educational experience and outcomes of our most able learners, ensuring they make outstanding progress.

Core Programme

- Students will be given opportunities to teach other pupils within the school. This may be their peers or younger pupils from Year 5+.
- All members of the G2G Programme are expected to attempt the "Sharples Challenge Club" activities in their lessons.
- All members of the G2G Programme are expected to attend at least two extra-curricular clubs per week.

Enrichment

Members of the G2G Programme will be offered a series of enrichment opportunities that they can sign up to:

- University visits e.g. Cambridge University Residential taster event.
- A visiting lecture series – monthly lectures from outstanding speakers from the fields of medicine, law, literature etc.
- A series of enrichment trips to local museums and events e.g. Manchester Science Museum, Jodrell Bank.
- "Teach to the Top" or "4T" sessions which are breakfast sessions held in the morning by subject teachers aimed at the most able.
