## Ms Webster's letter regarding the first week back

## Dear Parent/Carer,

I hope you and your family are well. As we approach the end of the first week of the new academic year, I would like to share with you a few of our highlights.

We are very proud of the achievements of our Year 11 school leavers who achieved a fabulous set of GCSE results. The Class of 2022 achieved $64 \%$ Grade 5 or above in both maths and English, with 83\% achieving at least a Grade 4 in both subjects. In addition, the number of students achieving Grade 9's continues to rise, year on year. Once again Sharples has achieved outcomes which are significantly higher than national figures on all key accountability measures.

This week we have welcomed 240 new Year 7 students into the Sharples' family. This important milestone was marked when I presented each student with their new school tie. This year's tie ceremony was extra special because it took place in our fabulous theatre which has been significantly upgraded over the summer break (see picture below). Next week, the induction of our Year 7's will continue with Sharples Fresher's Week which includes the much-anticipated Y7 disco which is hosted by our Y11 Gold Tie students.

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This year we are introducing 'silent starts' to every lesson at Sharples. Students are expected to enter the classroom in silence, take their seat and begin the starter activity. From 12th September, students who do not do this will receive a 10-minute detention (N1). This purposeful start to lessons will ensure that all students are immediately focused on learning in every classroom. To support us with this, we would appreciate it if you could reinforce to your child the importance of making the most of every minute of learning time available to them.

On a final note, the vast majority of students have returned to school looking incredibly smart in their school uniform. Sharples School's first DofE Silver Award Students complete their expedition


Over the weekend of the 15th, 16th and 17th July, 18 students from Year 10 completed their Duke of Edinburgh's Silver Award qualifying expedition with three days' walking and camping in the Derbyshire Peak District.

Having completed their Bronze Awards last year, they have been the first group of Sharples School students to follow their Silver Award programme.
For their Silver expedition, the students had to be self-sufficient in their teams of 6 or so. They planned their routes, did all their own navigating, carried their own camping equipment and supplies, cooked their own evening meals on their camp stoves and put up and slept overnight in their own tents. They also carried out a project investigating the history of the Plague outbreak in Eyam, Derbyshire in 1665, the village that quarantined itself to prevent the Plague from spreading to neighbouring villages. All 18 passed with flying colours.
Building on their Bronze Award experience, the students had gained valuable experience and learned lessons from their training walks in the countryside close to

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Most importantly perhaps, the students have developed and repeatedly shown teamwork, independence and resilience, organising and planning their own activities, showing commitment in getting them done and supporting each other with smiles on their faces. They have persevered resiliently when things have gone against them and they will carry these qualities and maturity with them in their GCSE studies and in all that they do after that. They will also have the opportunity to complete their Gold Award in the future. Congratulations and very well done!

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Science Enrichment September 9th 2022


Summer school saw our Year 7s take part in a number of STEM activities. Students were introduced to using Bunsen burners, discovered how light can be split into different colours and investigated how to design paper helicopters effectively! Students were also introduced to Sharples Observatory. They learned how to use software to find stars and planets and positioned the telescope accordingly.
In the next few weeks, Science Enrichment at Sharples continues with new lunchtime clubs. These include:
