Dear Parent/Carer.

I am writing to inform you of the arrangements for the end of term and expectations for the start of the new school year in September.

From Monday, 17 to Thursday, 20 July lessons will be as normal. Please ensure your child attends school on time every day this week for a prompt start to registration at 8.45am. Friday, 21 July will be a non-uniform day for students, there is no charge for this. Students will be dismissed from school at 12.30pm and the school buses will be available at this earlier time. There will be an extended canteen service available at break time for all students. Those entitled to the Free School Meal allowance will be able to access it at break time.

During the last weeks of the academic year, we celebrate our achievements and showcase our learning community. We enjoyed our Year 11 Prom at the Last Drop Hotel and we also staged a very successful Summer Music Evening. Beyond that we have our Sports Day, our Rewards Trip to Blackpool Pleasure Beach as well as numerous curriculum visits to enhance our students' cultural capital. In the final week of term, we will also host our Achievement Assemblies when we celebrate the academic successes of our students.

As always, we will also be placing an unrelenting focus on our 'high expectations, no excuses' culture from September to ensure that we build on our tradition of academic success year-on-year for Sharples students. Our high expectations extend to school uniform, as when they are wearing their uniforms, our students are ambassadors for Sharples. To maintain these high standards, I would like to draw your attention to the following statements from our Uniform Policy:

- All pupils require a school bag for books, equipment, etc.
- Shoes should be black polishable or simulated leather. Black laces only. No boots, canvas shoes or trainer style shoes, including branded sports makes, for example (but not limited to) Nike, Adidas, Reebok, Converse and Vans



• Make-up, jewellery and nail varnish must not be worn for school. If ears are already pierced, one small, plain stud may be worn in each earlobe

- Year 7 students will start on Tuesday 5, September, they should arrive no later than 8.40am to ensure a prompt start to the school day at 8.45am
- All other year groups (Y8-Y11) will return on Wednesday 6, September, they should arrive no later than 8.40am to ensure a prompt start to the school day at 8.45am

I hope you have a safe and restful summer and I look forward to welcoming your child back to Sharples for the start of the new school year.

Sharples Baccalaureate



It has been fantastic to see the number of Year 7 students enjoying the selection of clubs that have been on offer since the start of September. Over 40 clubs have been available including: STEM, textiles, chess, performing arts and jewellery club to name a few! Each time a student attended a club they received a point that contributed towards their Sharples Baccalaureate. Students could gain a bronze, silver or gold award at the end of each term depending on how many points were collected. The number required to gain each award was also increased after every term. Across the whole year, more than 16,000 points were collected with 210 students achieving at least one bronze award since the start of the academic year!

This term points were increased to an all time high! To gain a bronze award, 15 points were needed, silver required 25 with gold needing 35! A platinum award was also introduced this term for those who collected over 40 points. With the incentives of rewards and prizes, commitment and attendance at clubs has been fantastic this term and this was evident on Thursday afternoon where over 50 students were treated to two free periods full of activities and treats! Straight after lunch, those who gained their platinum award had the afternoon off, where they had the option of craft making, pool, football, Nintendo Switch and many other games!

Year 7 have shown amazing dedication to clubs since September and we hope the new year group have the same enthusiasm! Brand new to this year, we also appointed 20 Sharples Bacc ambassadors who will help lead the programme into Year 8 and support the new group of Year 7's.

Thank you to all the staff who have organised clubs at lunchtimes and afterschool to ensure Year 7 had a fantastic extra-curricular programme!



Science Enrichment Newsletter

Science Show



The year kicked off with an amazing science show put on by the science teachers, with fantastic support from the science technicians. Students were amazed by a vast array of demonstrations from instantly freezing ice-cream to making bottle rockets.

Primary school visits

Throughout the year, students from local primaries (pictured on the next page) have been invited into Sharples to do a vast range of activities. Whether it be learning about space and visiting the Sharples Observatory or getting to use a science laboratory to explore light and sound, the students were amazed by the activities on offer.







Clubs

The attendance and participation of the STEM Club (pictured above) has been fantastic all year. Students have had the opportunity to do some incredible activities.

In the Astronomy club, students worked tirelessly to create a model space probe, they learned about how asteroid impacts have shaped the lunar surface and made horizontal launching rockets.

STEM Week

Students competed to create the best marble run and elevator pitch, science carousel, learned how to handle chickens and were treated to the Food Showdown.

Jodrell Bank

Astronomy students were amazed by the enormous radio telescope at Jodrell Bank (pictured right), and were amazed by the incredible discoveries that were possible through using radio arrays.

Minesweeper competition



In the final week of term, the Sharples team of Cherie, Lawrence, Zahra, Angus and Abby went to the University of Manchester to compete in a Minesweeper competition. The students built and used their robot EROL (Excellent Revealer of Landmines). They came 4th in the navigation challenge, before finishing 3rd in the presentation and then came 1st in the metal detection challenge, identifying all 8 objects correctly.
