The Student Affairs Committee attended a theatrical production of 'Cut' this past Monday whilst visiting the Knife Angel (pictured) in Bolton Town Centre. The show is based off a true story related to knife crime in Liverpool. The production was in partnership with the Knife Angel during its visit to Bolton this November. The Angel is 27 foot tall and is made up of over 100,000 blades that have been seized and handed in off the streets by various Police forces across the country.
Students were able to see first hand the sheer amount of knives/blades used as part of the structure and the problem that this presents in day to day life. The production highlighted the implications and sometimes deadly consequences of carrying a knife regardless of the circumstance or reason for this.
