

STEM club

This week in the STEM club pupils were testing their reaction times! So important in avoiding collisions on the road, or even reacting to events during a game. A fast reaction time allows us to remain agile and efficient in responding to stimuli. Using only a metre ruler (pictured right) pupils were able to use a conversion table to work out their reaction time in seconds. The best was under 0.12s! Next week pupils will be completing flame tests with different chemicals.

Astronomy club

This week, students investigated how light can be reflected, scattered, refracted and dispersed. These are key skills in studying space as they can be used to determine the composition of stars and therefore be used to work out the size, distance and temperature of distant celestial objects.



Observatory visit

As part of the Year 9 space topic, students were invited to visit the observatory, where they were given a tour by the Year 11 astronomy students. Back in the classroom, they were treated to interesting and illuminating talks about neutron stars, black holes and supernovae (as pictured on the next page).


