Pupils were fascinated by the wide range of art and queued to see the Mona Lisa. Sunday was a sightseeing day, with pupils seeing the main sights during a boat tour. The rain didn't deter the group, and pictures were expertly taken at the Eiffel Tour, les Champs Élysées and L'Arc de Triomphe by some of the budding photographers. On Monday, pupils spent the entire day enjoying the rides in Disneyland Paris. Thrillseekers took advantage of the shorter queues to go on some of the rides several times. Van Gogh's art was the main attraction on Tuesday morning, as pupils had the opportunity to look at some of the most famous impressionist masterpieces in the world at the Musée D'Orsay. The afternoon was reserved for science experiments in the Cité des Sciences, where pupils learned about nature, space, robots and human behaviour. After this jam-packed cultural break, pupils had a couple of days to relax before returning to school. It was an unforgettable experience full of art, history and traditions.

Well done to everyone who completed their home learning this week. The top scores for each year group, who all scored 100% are:


