April in Gardening Club



April has been a very busy month in Gardening club as Spring has really taken hold. The first week back after the Easter break saw our Year 7 students potting on their sunflower seeds, which they planted in early March. They separated the seedlings into individual pots, which they then took home to grow into big, beautiful sunflowers.

Last week we planted lots of salad and vegetable seeds, to again take home or for the food technology department to use in lessons. We have lettuce, chives, oregano, rocket, cosmos and peas growing steadily now the warmer weather is here. Students also took home some wildflower seeds, with a pot and some compost to also grow at home. Keep us posted on their progress please Year 7. Several students also wrote acrostic poems, for our whole-school EcoCode.

Mrs Finney has had some seed potatoes on her window ledge in U47 for the past month, chitting (which allows the 'eyes' to sprout reading for planting). These were planted last week in a freshly cleared raised bed in our courtyard garden. The Year 10 students, with some help from Year 7, have spent weeks clearing the overgrown shrubs and mulching the soil to give our potato crop the best start possible. Watch this space for our potato progress!

Finally, on Wednesday this week, as the weather is so lovely, we took the gardening club students to the wildlife area at the back of school. This area was developed over the summer break, with new decking and viewing platforms continued



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surrounding a pond and wildlife area. It was the first time most of our students had seen this area, which is gated off from the main outdoor space, due to the deep pond. We collected a massive bag of litter, which had blown in over the winter and we looked for wildlife in and around the pond. We spotted water boatmen and spiders scooting across the pond's surface and heard lots of song birds in the trees.

Our plans for the month ahead are to separate our salad, flower and vegetable seedlings, care for our recently planted orchard and native trees and submit our application to become a Green Flag Eco-School.




