
Black Heroes of Mathematics Youth Festival



This week, Year 7 students took part in an inspiring online event as part of the Black Heroes of Mathematics Youth Festival.

The festival celebrates the centenary of a historic milestone: on 26 September 1925, Dr Elbert Cox became the first Black person in the world to earn a PhD in Mathematics. Schools across the UK are joining in the celebrations leading up to the 100th anniversary.

As part of the event, Nira Chamberlain OBE, a professional mathematician, led an engaging session exploring whether certain phenomena should be considered Mathematics or Physics.

Calling all Ghost Story Writers!


Are you haunted by ideas? Do you hear whispers in the night... telling you to enter our Spine-Chilling Ghost Story Competition?
