Year 11 Student Juwairyyah S Represents Sharples School on the World Stage Through UNICEF

We are incredibly proud to celebrate one of our outstanding Year 11 students, Juwairyyah, who has been making a remarkable impact on global issues through her work with UNICEF. As a youth representative for the organisation, Juwairyyah has taken part in high-level projects tackling some of the most urgent challenges facing the world today — from humanitarian crises to climate action.

Her first major project focused on fundraising for the crisis in Gaza. Collaborating with fellow UNICEF youth members from across the globe, Juwairyyah played a key role in raising an astounding £7 million. Of this, £2 million was directed to support children affected by the conflict in Gaza, while the remaining £5 million went toward vital global child health programmes — all with the backing of major supporters, including well-known brands such as Huda Beauty.



Following this success, Juwairyyah turned her attention to environmental advocacy. She conducted research into key climate issues and contributed to the development of youth-led policy recommendations. Her work was officially recognised at an international level, with her recommendations included in the United Nations Youth Officers' Summary Report, which was presented at the High-Level Event at the United Nations General Assembly.


Her efforts continue closer to home, where she is now helping to lead a UK-wide petition campaign aimed at changing two national laws that threaten the environment. One targets the Water (Special Measures) Bill, which currently allows sewage pollution and risks damaging ecosystems. The second challenges Part 3 of the same Bill, which could weaken protections for nature by permitting large-scale developments to destroy natural habitats. Juwairyyah, along with other young activists across the country, is determined to push for change and protect the environment for future generations.

This is not just an incredible personal achievement — it's a moment of immense pride for the Sharples family. To see one of our own students standing up for global issues, using her voice to create change, and being recognised on such prestigious platforms is truly inspirational.

We couldn't be more proud of Juwairyyah, and we can't wait to see what she goes on to achieve next.

The Wrap Up box is in Student Reception. Please have a look at home and deposit any donations in the box before half term.








