Taking part in a Mock Trial on Knife Crime, they demonstrated our school values throughout — even when the courtroom drama reached soap-opera levels.

Our "defendant," Zach J — masterfully portrayed by the ever-talented Amaara M — took to the dock with a performance so dramatic it could have earned a standing ovation... though whether it helped their case is another matter entirely.

A host of witnesses were duly called and cross-examined on the stand, each delivering their account of events with varying degrees of composure and, shall we say, attitude. In fact, proceedings became so lively that our presiding Judge Oriola, had to intervene more than once to restore order in the court. Objection sustained, indeed.



Computer Science Trip to The National Museum of Computing, Bletchley Park



Friday 28th November, students from the Computer Science department enjoyed an inspiring and action-packed visit to The National Museum of Computing at Bletchley Park—home to one of the world's most important collections of historic and modern computing technology. The trip offered students a unique opportunity to step into the past, present and future of computing through four hands-on activities designed to extend their learning beyond the classroom.

They began with a workshop on AI and robotics, exploring how machines learn and getting the chance to guess which movie characters were AI generated or not. A data trail around the museum followed, where students discovered key exhibits and saw Colossus, the world's first programmable electronic computer.

Students then learned to code on BBC computers, creating a version of Snakes—a fun challenge that highlighted how programming was taught in the 1980s. The day ended with a retro gaming session, giving everyone a taste of early video games and how the industry has evolved.

The trip was a fantastic blend of history, innovation, and hands-on learning. Students returned inspired, with a deeper appreciation of how computing has developed—and how far it may go in the future. The Computer Science department looks forward to returning to Bletchley Park for more exploration and discovery next year.

The club continues to provide engaging and creative opportunities for younger pupils to explore physics in a fun and accessible way, while our Year 10 mentors develop their own leadership and communication skills in the process.




