

- 4 or 5 GCSEs at grades 9 to 4 (A* to C), or equivalent, for a level 3 college course.
- 5 GCSEs at grades 9 to 4 (A* to C), or equivalent, including English and maths, for an advanced apprenticeship

Skills required:

- Design skills and knowledge.
- To be thorough and pay attention to detail.
- Knowledge of media production and communication.
- Knowledge of English language.
- The ability to come up with new ways of doing things..
- Thinking and reasoning skills.






