
Brain Power: Mapping the complexities of the human mind.

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


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Year 9 Statistics Taster and Careers Lesson

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

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Sharples Welcomes Back Former Student Irfan Kawri for a PE Options Talk

Irfan has a background in Education (Teaching and Pastoral) Coaching, Mentoring and Coach Development. He has spent the last 16 years working in Football at Elite level, this includes the professional and semi – professional game. Irfan is a UEFA A license coach and has been an opposition scout for a number of Premier League and Championship first teams. He also currently trains Premier league referees on developing a deeper understanding of the game.


This half term, it's Year 10's chance to get involved in this year's Literature Society.







YEAR 9 FOCUS






