Points Promotion Week

Last week marked the start of a new initiative aiming to reward students for their fantastic contributions within lessons. This was created to ensure that all students within the lesson are rewarded for doing what is expected of them and not just answering questions as an example.

We have collected and viewed some of the data from the week below:

- Over 83,000 points handed out.
- Each pupil (on average)
 received over 69 points for
 the week.
- Year 9 was the highest scoring year group (22,915), followed by Year 7 (20,478), Year 8 (19,713) & Year 10 (19,597).
- Mrs Heaton (MFL) was the teacher who rewarded the most points in the week (882).

We believe that the recent promotion was a fantastic idea that the majority of students engaged with positively. We cannot wait for the next!!



Cover Lessons
