Most Recent Meeting Points

There were several fantastic points that were made by the SAC, some of these points included;

- The SAC mentioned the request of some students to have different coloured jumpers. Ms Webster responded by saying this is something we can pick up in September to allow more time for more detailed conversations to be had about this. There could be a colour palette brought in to use as a reference.
- The school busses have been changed to 3:15 next year due to the extension of the school day starting from September. The extra 10 mins will be included in Form Time & P1, more value will be added to form during this time.
- More information on the zones for next year will be shared shortly.
- Lanyards will continue next year with added importance, not only to buy lunch but also to access the toilet. This will be done to manage who accesses and to ensure that toilet passes are being used properly.
- Students also asked if it was possible to have a mini timetable printed for the back of their lanyard.

Meeting with Mellors Caterers

Members of the SAC met with Mellors on several occasions this year with the most recent only a couple of weeks ago. This most recent meeting was a very constructive one with lots of feedback given and Mellors beginning to introduce the following actions;

- 1.To have more of popular selling items like waffles, croissants, burgers etc- to prepare more and up the quantities.
- 2. More flavours of the frozen juice caplets.
- 3. Send menu, any changes to serving days, specials, promotions to Cath on the Friday latest for the next week so emails, comms could be sent to students.
- 4. In addition to the daily menus on counter to have tickets/ write on glass of specific items on counter as it is confusing to what items it is.
- 5. To have more of the popular choice of curries, Chinese dishes etc that was done as part of a special theme day to include in menu so that it can be more frequently served on the counters.
- 6.To inform any menu changes to Cath beforehand so as to avoid any confusion with pupils at the counters of what is on offer.
- 7. More halal choices
- 8. Different size pots- regular and large for students who want a larger portion.
- 9. Meal deal to reflect the choice on the day.
- 10. To introduce popcorn as a snack.
- 11.To introduce Radnor fizz.




We were really grateful for the visit and look forward to working with Bolton Youth Voice more in the near future.
